TT banquet tickets are going fast

Tickets are being sold at a charge of \$30 per plate, or \$240 per table of eight persons. The menu includes a tossed with house dressing, prime rib of beef with au jus, baked potato with sour cream, rolls, butter and dessert, coffee and tea. A cash bar will be open during the dinner and the dance which follows the dinner.

Entertainment at the dance, which begins at 11:00 p.m. following the banquet, will feature a Native band, Nenana Unlimited. The dance will continue until as late as 5:00 a.m.

Roger Lang will preside as master of ceremonies. "I pickedup a high stove-pipe hat on a recent trip to Florida for the dinner. I've always wanted to wear a high top hat to the banquet," Lang told the Tundra

Times. Proceeds of an auction to be held at the dinner will go to the Howard Rock Scholarship Fund. A portrait of Chief Andrew Isaac, painted by artist Moses Wassilie and featured on the cover of this month's special Tundra Times Native Heritage edition will also be auctioned, with proceeds going to the Tundra Times.
