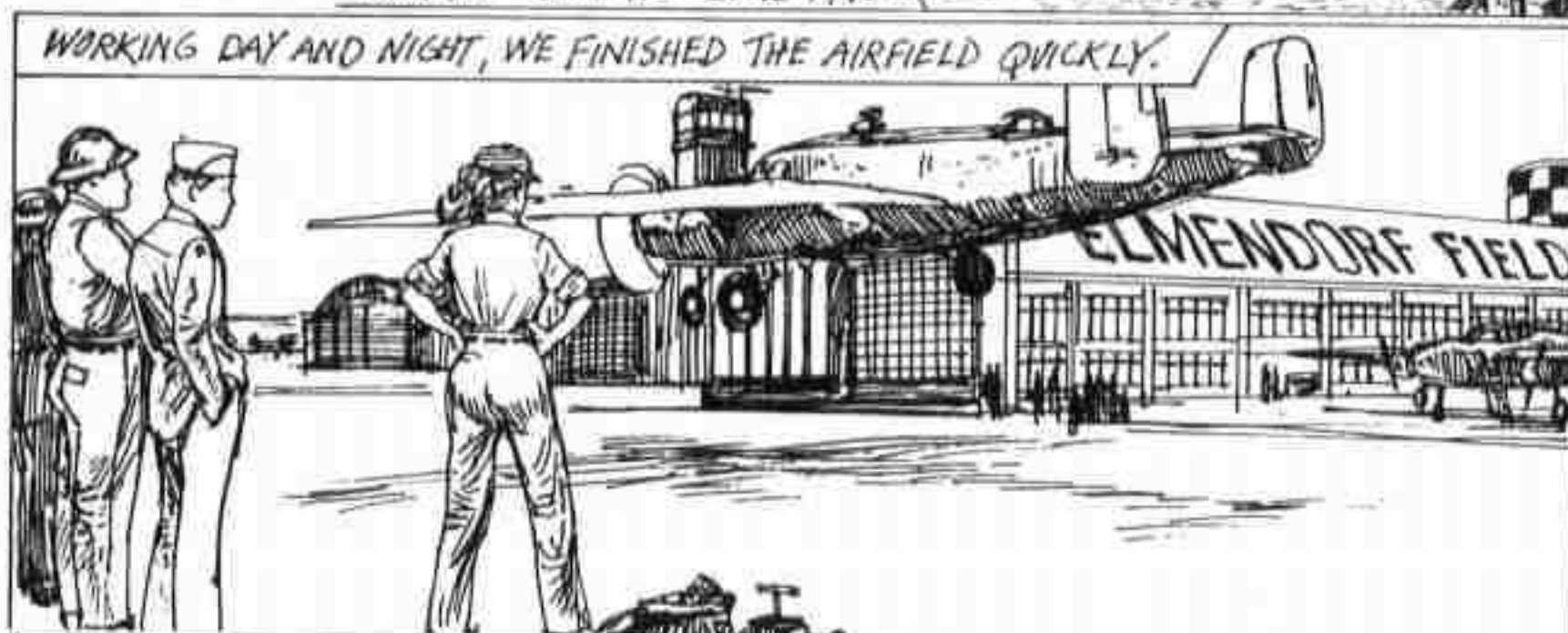
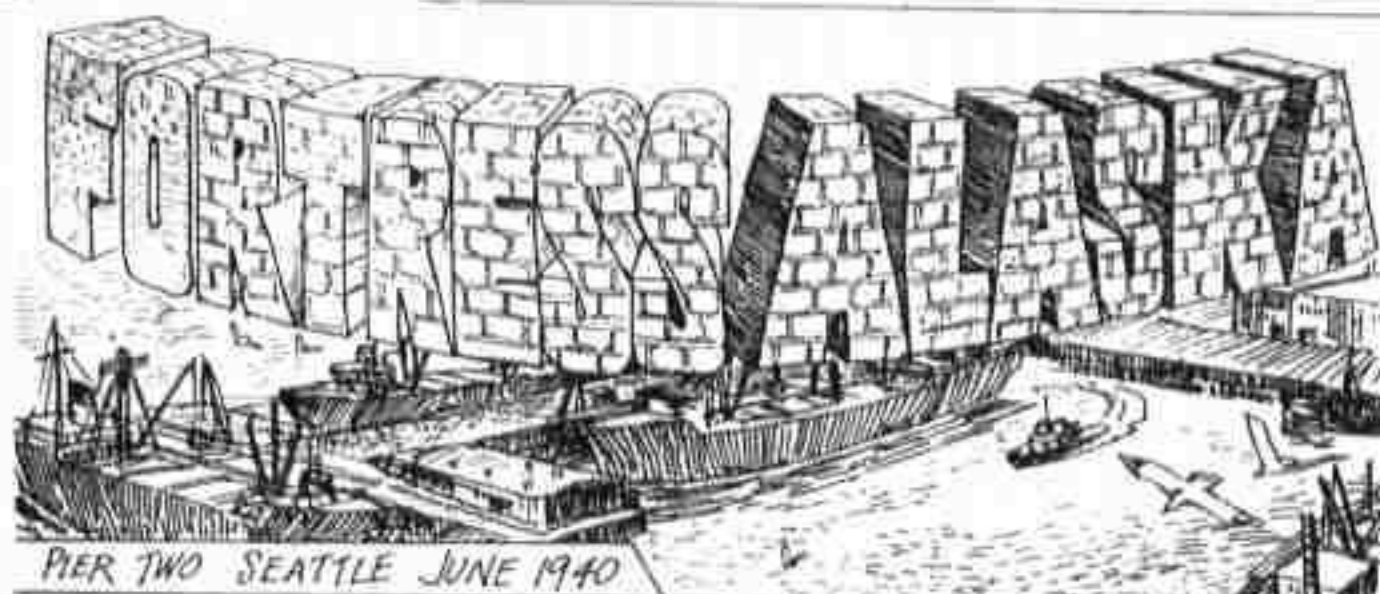

The Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor, December 7, 1941 stimulated other projects including construction of the Alaska Highway which linked Alaska to the lower forty-eight and enabled the military to bring supplies to Alaska by road.

Alaska's location made it very important in World War II. General Buckner, Commander of all U.S. forces in Alaska called the Aleutian Chain a "spear pointed straight at the heart of Japan." The Aleutians could be used as stepping stones in a U.S. attack on Japan or in a Japanese attack on the United States.
