

25 Laws Involved—

1971 State Laws of Concern To Rural Areas Compiled

A legislative report compiled by Richard Pope, Legislative Aide for the Rural Alaska Development Group (RADG) is ready for dissemination throughout the State.

The report contains a brief summary of 25 laws passed during the 1971 session of the State Legislature which, primarily, are of concern to rural residents.

Also included in the report are a list of newly funded projects and positions. The final portion of the report contains a list of bills which the rural legislators will be working on next year.
