REGULATIONS NOTICE OF PROPOSED REGULATIONS GAMES OF CHANCE AND SKILL

Notice is given that the Department of Revenue and the Department of Commerce and Economic Development, under Governor Cowper's Executive Order Number 74 dated January 9, 1989, and under authority of AS 05.15.080, and AS 05.15.130 and AS 05.15.180(c)(4), proposes to repeal regulations dealing with authorized games of chance and skill.
