COMPLIANCE MONITOR 1 Two Positions Available

Qualifications: 2 years college, Yupik speaking preferred. Must be familiar with construction activities, union agreements, labor laws, federal and state EEO regulations and American Indian/Alaska Native law as pertains to employment and training. Strong math background is also desirable.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES: Individuals will be responsible for interviewing, screening and referral of persons seeking employment and training. Compliance Monitors duties also include evaluations and documentation of weekly and monthly manpower utilization for prime and subcontractors in compliance with contract stipulations. This position requires the monitoring and update of the regional and village out of work and referral list. Also requires village

travel for the purpose of on-site review of construction projects. Compliance Monitor will act as advocate for Alaska Native construction personnel, i.e. speak out on their behalf when it becomes necessary, take steps to insure their interests are not being subordinated to a secondary interest, and take steps to prevent adverse exploitations. NOTE: Position requires continuous travel throughout the AVCP region.

Local public and non-profit organizations are eligible applicants. A cash or in-kind match is required. Grant applications must be postmarked no later than October 31, 1983.

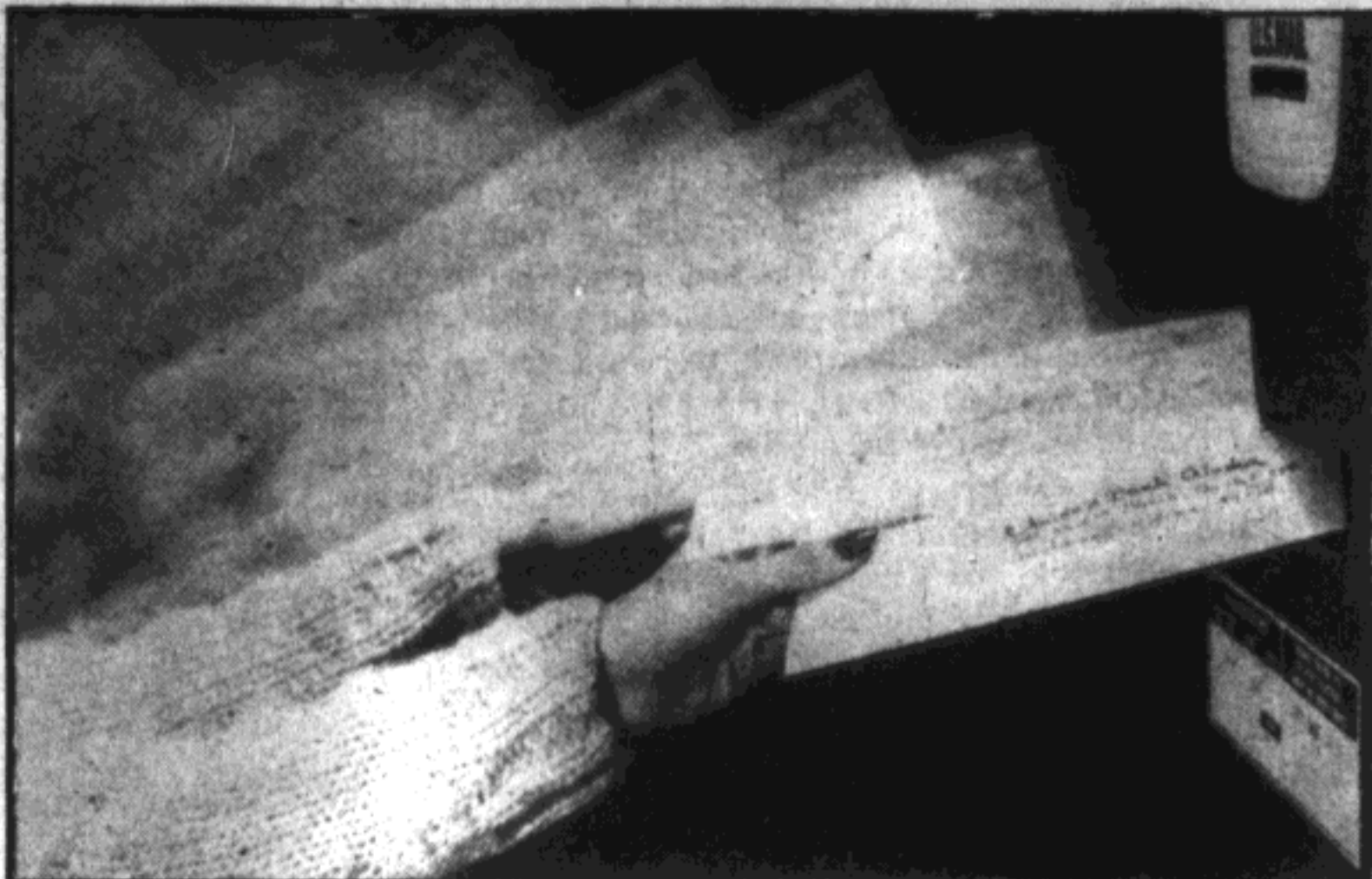
