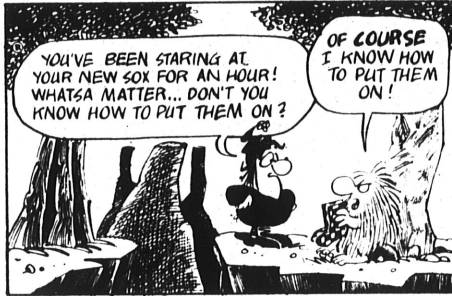
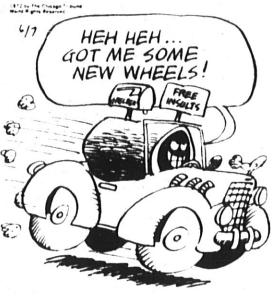
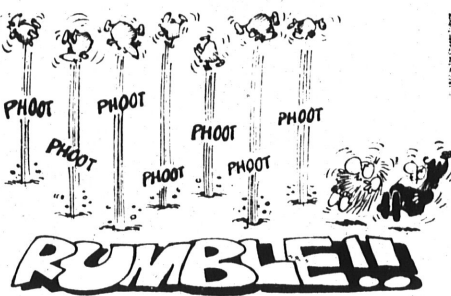

Community Resources Directory

So you know how to splint a broken bone, apply a tourniquet, and give artificial resuscitation. These are all good skills in an emergency.

But what would you do to help someone in need of a place to sleep for the night; someone who is coming down from an acid trip; someone who wants a VD exam, or someone who needs a bail bond.

These and many more problem situations can be easily and quickly solved by consulting the Community Resources Directory put together by the Fairbanks Crisis Line.

This valuable directory contains a complete list of social services in the Fairbanks area; where they are located; what they do; phone numbers; directors' names, and services rendered.

The Community Resources Directory can be accurately called the most comprehensive resource listing in the Fairbanks area, invaluable to anyone who deals with people (and that counts us all in).

The directory is constantly being changed, added to, and updated by the Crisis Line Resources Committee. It is the lifeblood of the Crisis Line. Volunteers use the directory daily to aid callers.

Originally Crisis Line compiled the directory to use in its volunteer training programs, but they feel guilty keeping all this useful information to themselves. They are offering the directories to the community.
