

Calif. Indians

Senator John V. Tunney (D-Calif.) today urged an end to "Federal discrimination against California Indians" in the allocation of Bureau of Indian Affairs funds.

"Although California has more than 91,000 Indians," Tunney said, "the Bureau is allowed to recognize only 6,100 as eligible for Federal assistance and services."

Tunney is seeking an additional \$14 million in educational, health and housing services for California's Indians.

He has requested the boost through administrative decision by the Secretary of Interior and through action by the Senate Appropriations Committee.

In a statement in the Senate today, Tunney said that the vast majority of California Indians are excluded from services because they do not live on Federal trust reservations.

"The injustice," Tunney said, "is that thousands of California Indians are not living on reservations because the Federal government either moved them off or promised them land which was never delivered."

"At the minimum, California Indians who live off-reservation and in rural areas should immediately be declared eligible for services by the Bureau of Indian Affairs."

Flooded Villages-

Eligible for Disaster SBA Loans

Villages which have been hit hard by floods along the Yukon and Kuskokwim Rivers have been declared eligible for disaster loan assistance from the Small Business Administration according to an announcement by Senator Ted Stevens.

Stevens said that all areas between the villages of Medfra and Kwigillingok on the Kuskokwim and all areas between Marshall and Kotlik on the Yukon are eligible.

The damage has been estimated at \$500,000, involving 35 homes and 11 businesses.

Applications will be accepted at the Seattle regional office of the SBA where they will be processed, however the Anchorage district office will send someone out to survey the areas as need indicates, Stevens said.
