17 AAC 05.040 requires the Department to maintain, by category of professional services, a professional services register through the filing of prequalification forms by prospective contractors and allows the deletion of prospective contractors who do not submit revised qualifications on at least a yearly basis.

17 AAC 05.050 states the procedures by which the department will solicit proposals from prospective professional service contractors and states the minimum requirements of a request for proposals.

17 AAC 05.060 establishes the procedures employed by the department when evaluating proposals submitted by prospective professional services contractors.

17 AAC 05.070 establishes the appeal procedure to be followed if a prospective contractor is dissatisfied with the award of the contract to a competitor.

17 AAC 05.080 states the minimum requirements for a properly awarded professional services contract.

17 AAC 05.090 provides that the formal requirements for the solicitation for professional services may be waived if the contract is with the only source of the service, public necessity will not permit delay, the service will be provided by a University of Alaska or a governmental agency, or the commissioner determines it is in the best interest of the state for a limited solicitation.

17 AAC 05.100 defines the terms commissioner, professional services, public necessity, request for proposal, and respondent as used in 17 AAC 05.030 through 17.05.100.
