Request for Grant Applications

The Older Alaskans Commission anticipates funding for FY 1983 for services for the State's senior citizens under Title III of the Older Americans Act, Public Law 89-73.

Funds may be used for services to the elderly which provide congregate and home delivered meals, information and referral, transportation, and outreach.

Local public and non-profit organizations are eligible applicants. A cash or in-kind match of 15% is required. Funds will be distributed equitably by geographic region. Proposals will be judged competitively and grant awards will be subject to the availability of funds. Grant applications must be postmarked no later than October 15, 1982.
