HUD Upgrading Its Office in Anchorage

The Department of Housing and Urban Development will be upgrading its Anchorage insuring office to a full state office on April 1, U.S. Sen. Ted Stevens announced today.

The office then will have full authority over all HUD functions and programs in Alaska.

HUD programs have been controlled by the Seattle regional office in the past.

The department said that new legislation last fall prompted it to review its various regional and area offices.

"This will be a great boon to the effective management of Alaskan housing program," Stevens said.

"Now Alaskans can have greater access to those administering the programs, and the administrators will be ther to see first-hand the unique Alaskan housing situation."

Pacific Halibut Commission Plans Charter

The International Pacific Halibut Commission plans to charter a setline halibut vessel for about 40 days beginning approximately June 1, 1975.

The vessel will conduct gear research and other field investigations in the Southeastern Bering Sea and off Kodiak Island. The charter will begin and end at Kodiak, Alaska.

The vessel must be fully equipped for setline fishing and have suitable accommodations for 9 men. Tenders will be accepted until April 18, 1975.

Interested owners should communicate with the International Pacific Halibut Commission for further information regarding the terms of the charter and for tender forms.

This event is looked forward to by the legislative wives and wives of former legislators for it gives the ladies an opportunity to meet informally with the governor's wife and each other in the setting of the Governor's Mansion.

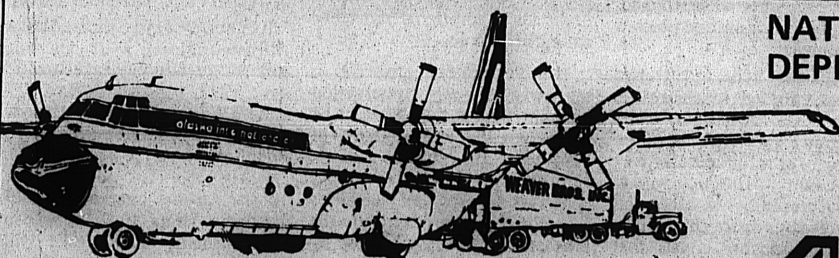
