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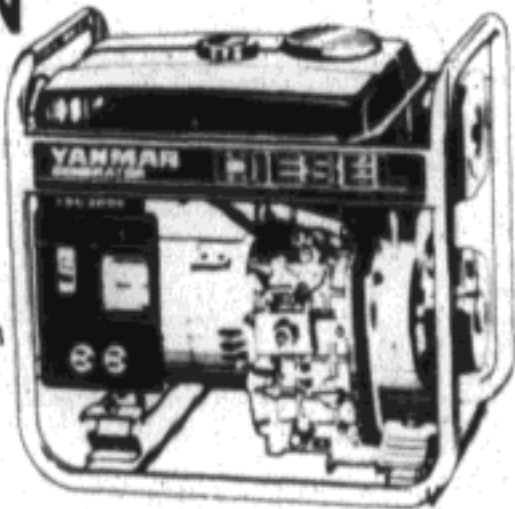

2. Provide for timely notification to clients about decisions regarding vocational rehabilitation services and an expedited case review process;
3. Establish a procedure for an administrative review;
4. Establish procedures for the fair hearing process; and
5. Set out a process for appeal to the Secretary of Education.

However, in the process of easement identification for a new conveyance near Red Devil, Alaska, it was found that the following easement should never have been included in Interim Conveyance No. 739 and, therefore, is terminated.

EASEMENT TO BE TERMINATED

- 2 c (EIN 14a C5) An easement fifty (50) feet in width for an existing access trail from the southeastern boundary of U.S. Survey 3771, sec. 31, T. 20 N., R. 44 W., Seward Meridian, and continuing in a southwesterly direction to public lands. The uses allowed are those listed above for a fifty (50) foot wide trail easement.

Easements to be terminated will be removed from our easement records and a formal Release of Interest issued when this decision becomes final.

As required by AS 44.62.250, notice is given that under authority vested by AS 44.47.980 and subsection (c) of sec. 2, ch. 94, SLA 1984 as amended by sec. 2, ch. 53, SLA 1986, the Department of Community and Regional Affairs, adopts as an emergency regulation 19 ACC.50 relating to the establishment of a process by which municipalities, impacted by oil or gas leasing in the National Petroleum Reserve — Alaska, may apply for and be eligible to receive grants to alleviate that impact.

The primary objective of the NPR—A Impact Program is to provide municipalities with financial assistance to help mitigate adverse impacts related to oil or gas leasing within the NPR—A, including exploration, production, and oil or gas transportation activities conducted under the authority of 42 U.S.C. 6508. Financial assistance may be available for planning, construction, maintenance, and operation of essential public facilities and other necessary provisions of public service.

Eligibility for assistance has two components: applicant eligibility and project eligibility as addressed in the regulations. Applicants must submit completed forms provided by the Department postmarked no later than September 15. The Department will review application for eligibility for NPR—A impact assistance and place applications in order of priority established within the regulations. Decisions in awarding of grants are final but subject to judicial review pursuant to State of Alaska Court Appellate Rule 602.
