Fisheries Board to meet in December

Important discussions are held every year at the Alaska Board of Fisheries. It is a good idea to attend, or to have a representative present, if there are any proposals affecting your fishery.

The deadline for submitting written public proposals was September 19th. You may still sign up at the meetings to comment on these.

A published list of the proposals should be available at the Fish and Game office in your area.



The Alaska Board of Fisheries is scheduled to begin its meetings in Anchorage next week, beginning Monday, December 1. On the agenda are 427 proposals for changes in regulations

for fish management during 1981, of which two of the most controversial are the herring fishery in the Bristol Bay area and the subsistence fishery in Cook Inlet. Hearings and meetings, which are open to the public, will be held in the Anchorage Westward Hotel.

The herring fishery of the Togiak and Bristol Bay may face some severe cutbacks after more than 5,200 tons of Togiak herring were dumped this season. That event will cause the Board

of Fisheries to consider proposals designed to prevent such waste in the future.

At least eleven proposals have been submitted by sport and commercial fishermen on Cook Inlet subsistence fisheries, after the court recently upheld the right of subsistence users to get first priority on the resource.
