Sealed bids in single copy for furnishing all labor, materials and equipment, and performing all work on Project I-F-M-0538(1), International Airport Road, Minnesota to Old Seward, described herein, will be received until 3:00 p.m. prevailing time, December 6, 1979 in the Division Director's Office, Division of Highway Design and Construction, Island Center Building, Douglas, Alaska.

This project will consist of grading, drainage, paving and illumination of 1.919 miles of roadway and signization of four intersections in Anchorage.

Principal items of work consist of the following: all required Construction Engineering by the Contractor; 128,700 tons of borrow; 47,500 cubic yards of structural excavation; 47,500 cubic yards of structural backfill; 25,300 tons of asphalt base course; 6,700 linear feet of water conduit, 16 inches, DI Class 52; all required traffic signal system; and all required highway lighting system.

All work shall be completed in 360 Calendar Days.

In accordance with requirements set forth by the "Federal Highway Administration", the following provisions are made a part of all advertisements for highway construction contracts:

"Bidders must submit certifications stating whether or not they intend to subcontract a portion of the work and, if so, that they have taken affirmative action to seek out and consider minority business enterprises as potential subcontractors. Each bidder intending to sublet part of the contract work shall make contact with potential minority business enterprises subcontractors to affirmatively solicit their interest, capability, and prices, and shall document the results of such contacts. A bidder's failure to submit this certification shall render his bid non-responsive."

Certification Form 25A320 will be included with the bidding documents.

NOTICE OF THE PROPOSED CHANGES IN THE REGULATIONS OF THE ALASKA PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION

Notice is given that the Alaska Public Utilities Commission, under authority vested by AS 42.05.151(a), proposes to amend regulations in Chapter 48 of Title 3 of the Alaska Administrative Code to implement, interpret or make specific AS 42.05.301, 42.05.361(a), 42.05.391, and 42.05.421(a) as follows:

(1) 3 AAC 48.390(c) is amended as follows: Permits APUC to authorize utility to offer untariffed services or equipment to customers by special contract under certain terms and conditions: the utility has filed a tariff covering the service or equipment offering; the APUC has suspended the operation of the tariff pending an investigation; the APUC has specified the rates that may be charged the customer under the special contract; the rates charged are reviewable and revisible; and the customer is advised by the special contract that he is potentially liable retroactively for increased rates with interest upon approval of the contract. Upon APUC final approval of the tariffed rates for service or equipment offerings, the special contract lapses, and service continues under the tariffed rates, terms, and conditions.

(2) 3 AAC 48.820(36) is amended as follows: Expands definition of "special contract" to include a written agreement between a utility and a customer, approved by the APUC, that would provide for interim, retroactively reviewable, revisable rates for service or equipment for which the utility has filed a tariff, the operation of which has been suspended by the APUC pending an investigation.

Notice is also given that interested person may present oral or written statements or arguments relevant to the action proposed at a hearing to be held at 9:00 am, on Monday, November 12, 1979, Room 1100 MacKay Building, 338 Denali Street, Anchorage, Alaska. Additionally, interested parties may submit briefs concerning the proposed adoption of these regulations by 4:00 pm, Wednesday, November 7, 1979. These interested parties also may submit drafts of proposed revisions or modifications in the text of the proposed regulations by 4:00 pm Wednesday, November 7, 1979.

The Alaska Public Utilities Commission, upon its own motion or at the instance of and interested person, may adopt the proposals as permanent regulations substantially as described above without further notice or may decide to take no action on them.
