UN declaration of the rights of the Child

Note — In proclaiming 1979 to be The Year of the Child, the United Nations has adopted the following declaration to spell out the rights of the child:

The right to:

affection, love and understanding. adequate nutrition and medical care. free education. full opportunity for play and recreation.

a name and nationality.

special care, if handicapped.

be among the first to receive relief in times of disaster.

be brought up to be a useful member of society and to develop individual abilities.

be brought up in a spirit of peace and universal brotherhood.

enjoy these rights, regardless of race, color, sex, religion, national or social origin.
