Sealed bids in single copy for furnishing all labor, materials and equipment, and performing all work on Project RS-0525(7), Wasilla-Fishhook described herein, will be received until 2:00 p.m. prevailing time, August 29, 1974 in the Commissioner's Office, Department of Highways, Island Center Building, Douglas, Alaska.

This project will consist of furnishing and placing approximately 56,000 tons of crushed aggregate base, Grading 'C', on 10.6 miles of roadway near Wasilla, Alaska.

All work shall be completed in 60 calendar days.

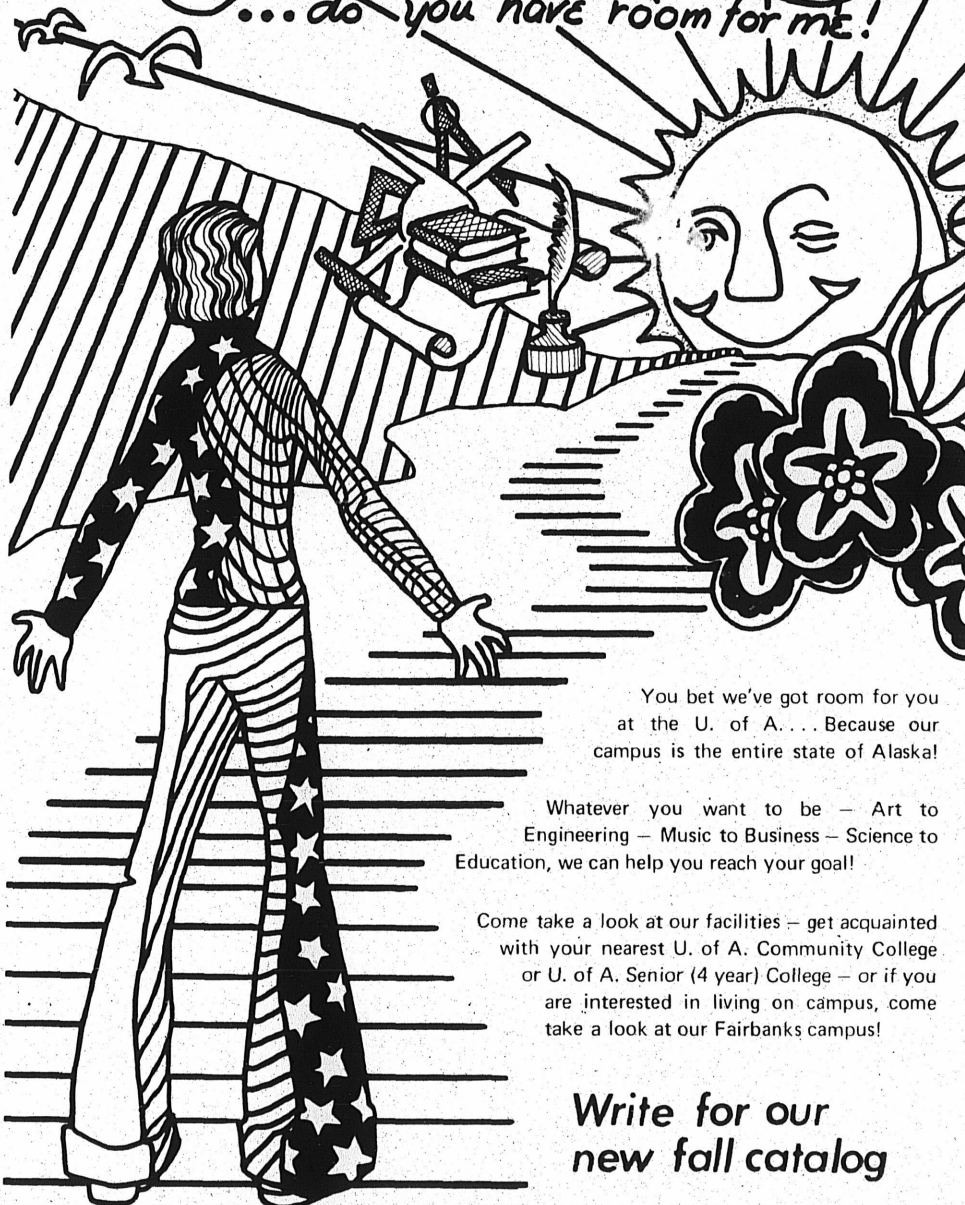
