Alaska Coastal Management Program

On May 22, 1986, the Alaska Coastal Policy Council (CPC) amended the Alaska Coastal Management Program (ACMP) regulations dealing with uses of state concern. A new section, 6 AAC 85.185 was added which establishes a procedure whereby any interested party may petition the CPC to amend a district policy if new circumstances or information arises after initial district program approval that causes the program to arbitrarily or unreasonably restrict or exclude a use of state concern.

This change was approved by the federal Office of Ocean and Coastal Resource Management on July 2, 1986, as provided in 15 CFR 923.84. Notice of the federal review was given on June 9, 1986.

The regulations were reviewed by the Department of Law and filed with the Lieutenant Governor's Office on July 24, 1986. The regulations will go into effect on August 24, 1986.

Termination of Section 17(b) Public Easement

On September 30, 1983, The Kuskokwim Corporation (successor in interest to Red Devil Incorporated) received Interim Conveyance No. 739 for the surface estate of certain lands selected under the provisions of the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act of December 18, 1971, and Calista Corporation received Interim Conveyance No. 740 for the subsurface estate for the same lands. Under

Sec. 17(b) of the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act, the Secretary of the Interior was authorized to reserve such public easements across Native-selected lands as he deemed necessary to guarantee access to public lands and major water ways or to fulfill agreements or international treaty obligations. Easements within Interim Conveyance No. 739 were issued in accordance with the November 27, 1978 guidelines. However, in the process of easement identification for a new conveyance near Red Devil, Alaska, it was found that the following easement should never have been included in Interim Conveyance No. 739 and, therefore, is terminated.

EASEMENT TO BE TERMINATED

2. c. (EIN 14a C5) An easement fifty (50) feet in width for an existing access trail from the southeastern boundary of U.S. Survey 3771, sec. 31, T. 20 N., R. 44 W., Seward Meridian, and continuing in a southwesterly direction to public lands. The uses allowed are those listed above for a fifty (50) foot wide trail easement.

Easements to be terminated will be removed from our easement records and a formal Release of Interest issued when this decision becomes final.

In accordance with Departmental policy, notice of this decision is being published once a week, for four (4) consecutive weeks in The Anchorage Times, The Anchorage Daily News, The Tundra Drums, and the Tundra Times.

Any party claiming a property interest in lands affected by this decision, an agency of the federal government, or regional corporation may appeal the decision to the Interior Board of Land Appeals, office of Hearings and Appeals, in accordance with the regulation in Title 43 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR), part 4, subpart E, as revised.

If an appeal is taken, the notice of appeal must be filed in the Anchorage District Office, Bureau of Land Management, 6881 Abbott Loop Road, Anchorage, Alaska 99507. Do not send the appeal directly to the Interior Board of Land Appeals. The appeal and copies of the pertinent case files will be sent to the Board from this office. A copy of the appeal must be served upon the Regional solicitor, 701 C Street Box 34, Anchorage, Alaska 99513.

The time limits for filing an appeal are:

- Parties receiving service of this decision by personal service or certified mail, return receipt requested, shall have thirty days from receipt of this decision to file an appeal.
- Unknown parties, parties unable to be located after reasonable efforts have been expended to locate, parties who failed or refused to sign their return receipt, and parties who received a copy of this decision by regular mail which is not certified, return receipt requested, shall have until August 29, 1986 to file an appeal.

Any party known or unknown who is adversely affected by this decision shall be deemed to have waived those rights which were adversely affected unless an appeal is timely filed with the Anchorage District Office, Bureau of Land Management.

The purpose of the meeting is to accept public comment on proposed changes to current federal regulations regarding the criteria governing who may receive health services from the Indian Health Service (IHS). Under this proposal, and eligible patient must be: (1) a member of, or eligible for membership in a federally recognized Indian tribe, (2) one-quarter (1/4) or more Indian or Alaska Native ancestry and (3) reside within a designated health service delivery area. If the person is not a member of or eligible for membership in a federally recognized Indian tribe, then the person must be of one-half (1/2) or more ancestry and reside within a designated health service delivery area.

All persons who wish to comment are encouraged to do so, however, in order to assure the most accurate consideration of their views, participants are encouraged to submit written statements at the meetings or direct those written statements to Richard J. McCloskey, Indian Health Service, Room 6A-20, 5600 Fishers Lane, Rockville, Maryland 20857. Written comments will be accepted up to October 8, 1986.
