## LEGAL NOTICE

NOTICE OF AN ADDITION TO THE REGULATIONS OF THE ALASKA PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION

Notice is hereby given that the ALASKA PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION proposes to add a new Chapter 50 to Title 33, Administrative Code entitled "Energy Conservation." The purpose of the chapter is to establish energy policy standards established in Sec. 13(b) and Sec. 303(b) of the Clean Air Act, as amended. The Commission will adopt these regulations if it finds that they are in the public interest and for the three purposes of PURPA: conservation of energy, efficient use of facilities and resources of electric and gas utilities, and establishment of equitable rates for electric and gas customers.

3 AAC 50.000 individual Electric Meters

This section would require, with certain exceptions, an electric utility

to install individual electrical meters for residential, commercial, and government buildings in multiple occupancy buildings and mobile home parks constructed after December 31, 1980.

3 AAC 50.300 Automatic Adjustment Clauses

This section would prohibit an electric utility from adjusting its rate to consumers under an automatic adjustment clause, unless the electric utility provides for the efficient use of resources as determined by the Commission at least every four years after a hearing. In addition, at least once every two years the Commission would conduct a hearing to determine whether the clause insures maximum economies in operations and purchases of fuel which affect the rates to which the clause applies.

3 AAC 50.400 Information to Electric Consumers

This section would require an electric utility to send an explanation of its rate schedule it proposes to the affected customers within 60 days of the proposed rate change to the Commission. In addition, upon customer request an electric utility should provide a written statement of the customer's energy consumption for any billing period during the year, unless this data is not reasonably ascertainable by the utility.

3 AAC 50.500 Uniform Service Disconnection Rules

This section establishes certain requirements for notice and hearing prior to disconnection of electric or gas service. The regulation specifies the electric or gas utility from terminating service where discontinuance would be especially disruptive to the health of customer or to a person residing on the customer's premises.

3 AAC 50.600 Advertising

This section, which is in conformance with the intent of AS 42.05.38, prohibits the use of public gas utilities from recovering from persons, other than the shareholders or other owners, the costs of any expenditures for promotional, political or good will advertising.

The Staff of the Commission will advise whether the proposed regulations, as applied to Alaska electric and gas utilities, will promote the purposes of PURPA. Staff's written report containing its recommendation, including any proposed revision to the regulations, will be available for distribution to interested persons by July 21, 1980. Any person who wishes to be heard at a public hearing given by the Commission will conduct a public hearing, beginning August 19, 1980, to discuss the proposed regulations.
