Phase II will consist of the prepa-
ration of a Master Plan defining
short, intermediate and long-term
development at the airport. The
plan will be based on the runway
alignment defined in Phase I.
Phase III will consist of a design
of the runway replacement with
a complete set of plans and specifi-
cations.

The State reserves the right to
cancel this agreement after Phases
I and II.
The work will commence in Janu-
ary 1982, with completion of
Phase I on April 1, 1982 and phase
II on June 1, 1982. Compensation
will be a firm fixed price for each
task, plus direct reimbursement
for the cost of travel, communi-
cation and printing.

Consultants will be required to
adhere to standard departmental
policy and procedures. Formal
proposals for the project must be
submitted by the top ranked consultants
