The Job Corps is for **young** men and women ages 16 to 21, who are out of school, unemployed and willing to leave Alaska for 6 months to 2 years of valuable skills training.

Job Corps Centers are located in Washington, Oregon, and Idaho and offer training in auto mechanics, carpentry, heavy equipment operation, masonry, forestry, clerical and secretarial positions, dental assistance, and many others. While at the center, young people can also earn a high school diploma or GEID.

All Job Corps members are provided free transportation, medical/dental care, and even monthly spending money. Corpsmembers are eligible for a paid two week leave to return to their homes in Alaska.

Upon completion of training, Job Corps graduates receive assistance in locating and finding jobs with good futures.

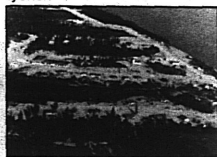

REQUEST FOR ARTWORK  
PROPOSALS ANNOUNCED

Sealaska Corporation, the Alaska Native Corporation for Southeast Alaska, hereby announces the opening of competition for the selection of a work of art which will be used for the cover of Sealaska Corporation's 1981 Annual Report to be published by the Corporation for the benefit and information of its shareholders. The competition is open only to Alaska Native artists with Sealaska Corporation shareholders given preference.

The proposed work of art will be commissioned by the Sealaska Corporation Public Affairs Department and the original artwork will become the property of the Corporation for its use as the Corporation, or its officers or agents, see fit. Artists submitting proposals should consider that the artwork will be published as the cover of an annual report, which will utilize a standard 8 1/2 by 11 format, when preparing their sketches or designs. The artwork should represent the culture of the majority of Sealaska Corporation shareholders. There are no limitations on media to be used by the artist except that the item should be designed with its use as a cover firmly in mind.

All submittals for the project must be received no later than December 18, 1981, at 4:30 p.m. No late submittals will be accepted by the Commissioning agency.
