"All other candidates have aligned themselves to special interests that are not necessarily in the best interests of Alaska. The incumbent, Mike Gravel, is more inclined to the national limelight than he is to the concerns of Alaska. Clark Gruening, if elected, will be one strong person for Alaska in Washington."
