weeks after the plans have been finalized and after implementation schedules have been established.

The AEWC announced that only Chairman Jacob Adams was authorized to speak on behalf of the AEWC.

The AEWC elected new officers. Jacob Adams was re-elected as Chairman. Roger Silook was re-elected, Vice Chairman and

John Oktollik was elected Secretary-Treasurer.
