

Vote totals throughout Alaska

Editor's note: The following are vote totals for races throughout Alaska. The figures are still unofficial, but they include 440 of 442 precincts.

Shown are the party of the candidate — R, Republican; D, Democrat; L, Libertarian; AI, Alaska Independent; RM, Republican Moderate — the total number of votes and the percentage they represent.

The voter turnout was 56.3 percent — 164,107 ballots cast out of 291,121 registered voters.
