Angela Y. Davis will give a free lecture on "Peace and International Affairs," at 8 p.m. Thursday in the Wendy Williamson Auditorium.

Davis is the author of numerous essays in the areas of black liberation, political prisoners and the penal/judicial system, the struggle for women's equality and U.S. history.

Davis has attained a bachelor of arts degree in French literature, a master's degree in philosophy and is currently enrolled in a philosophy doctorate program in Berlin.

In 1979 Davis was awarded the Lenin Peace prize by the Soviet Union.
