



ANEC meeting held with AFN youth, elders

"A New Beginning" is the theme of the fourth Annual Alaska Native Education Council conference.

The conference will be held at the Egan Convention Center in Anchorage, Oct. 22-23. It will be in conjunction with the Alaska Federation of Natives Elders Conference and Youth Convention.

Nineteen workshops are planned during the two days, covering topics concerning Indian Education programs, Native teachers, administrators and professionals, library resources, career and vocational education, drug and alcohol prevention, Head Start programs, financing college, effective teaching practices and student development.

On Oct. 22, the AFN Education Committee will hold an open forum from 2-2:50 p.m. for participants to bring forth concerns and issues.

The AFN Education Committee is a joint committee of ANEC and AFN Board of Directors created to advise AFN on education issues.

Isabella Brady, 1988 ANEC Educator of the Year, will be the guest speaker at the awards luncheon to honor student, parent, educator and Native program of the year for 1990.

The "Native Education Issues" panel will be moderated by Rosita Worl and will include educators from the Alaska Department of Education, University of Alaska and Alaska Pacific University.

Rep. Eileen MacLean, D-Barrow, co-chair of the Alaska Legislature's Joint Committee on School Performance, will wrap up the conference.
