allow the signature of an authorized representative as a substitute for a personal signature in certain circumstances;

incorporate current policy regarding reimbursement of disbursement;

provide for a transition to a retrospective system with limited interruption of benefits; and

provide for various minor changes in the administration of the program.

The purpose of this action is to clarify responsibilities and duties of the department, clarify requirements imposed of benefit recipients, delete provisions and references that no longer apply to the operation of the program, incorporate policy into regulations, and streamline administration of the program.
