Former state Department of Education transportation officer Greg Thies has pleaded no contest to two counts of embezzling

over \$40,000 from the state. Thies entered his plea in Juneau Superior Court last week. He is to be sentenced Sept. 18. and could be ordered to serve up to 15 years in jail for each count and to make restitution.

Thies was indicted by a grand jury last year after an investigation revealed that while he was

employed by the Department of Education in 1978 and 1979. Thies used state money to pay off some personal debts.

The grand jury probe found that state funds which were payments for school district bus contracts were deposited in a Ju-

neau bank in a spcial account
