

Applicants sought for scholarships

The Center for Northern Studies in Wolcott, Vt., has announced it will award two or more scholarships to Native students to enroll in the center's Certificate in Northern Studies program, according to the school.

The amount of each award is based on individual need after considering other available aid such as federal, state and Native corporation grants. The maximum value of the award per student is \$15,100. The award will

enable qualified students to participate in the center's nine-month interdisciplinary program.

Applicants may be Alaska Natives, Canadian Inuit, Indians and Metis and Greenlanders.

The curriculum provides a liberal arts background while preparing students for roles in northern research, resource management, wildlife management, policymaking and teaching. In return, they will par-

ticipate in teaching about their culture at the center, as well as providing perspectives and knowledge.

Founded in 1971, the Center for Northern Studies is a non-profit, research and educational organization in northern Vermont specializing in the study of the Circumpolar North.
