Game proposals asked

JUNEAU—The Board of Game announced today that public proposals to establish the 1977-78 hunting and trapping regulations are now being accepted. Proposed changes must be received by Jan. 31, 1977 if they are to be considered at the Board of Game meeting starting March 29, 1977 in Juneau.

James W. Brooks, Commis-sioner of the Department of Fish and Game, said that the Board of Game is soliciting proposals for only certain sections of the hunting and trapping regulations, rather than all of them. In December of 1976 the board adopted a procedure establishing a rotation system for considering regulatory proposals. This system assures that all regulations will be open for public review at least once every four years. Some sections dealing with seasons and bag limits (such as those on moose, caribou, and brown-grizzly bear) will be considered every year. A listing of the sections that are open for proposals to be considered at the March 1977 board meeting may be obtained from any Department of Fish and Game office or from local fish and game adivosry committees.
