The Department of Natural Resources, Division of Minerals and Energy Management will hold a public meeting at 9 A.M. on Thursday, February 18, 1982. The meeting will be held at the Anchorage Municipal Assembly Chambers, 3500 East Tudor Road, Anchorage.

The meeting is called to discuss the seasonal drilling restriction which limits exploratory drilling on Beaufort Sea oil and gas leases to the winter months. The restriction is being re-evaluated. A draft report discussing the restriction is being prepared by the Division and will be available for review on February 11th. The report will be discussed at the February 18th meeting.
