FINAL DECISION AND FINDING
UNDER AS 38.05.035(a)(14)
REGARDING PROPOSED OIL
AND GAS LEASE SALE 36
The Department of Natural Resources, Division of Minerals and Energy Management (DMEM), gives formal notice under AS 38.05.035 (a)(3) of its intention to make a final decision under AS 38.05.035 (a)(14) regarding the sale of oil and gas leases in proposed Competitive Oil and Gas Lease Sale 36. Before the sale may be held, the Director of the Division of Minerals and Energy Management must make a written final decision that the sale is in the best interest of the state. This decision, issued pursuant to AS 38.05.035(a)(14), will set out the facts and applicable law upon which the Director bases his determination that the sale of oil and gas leases in proposed sale 36 will or will not best serve the interests of the state. This final decision will be available to the public in March, 1982.

A preliminary analysis of the potential effects of proposed sale 36 and the means by which they may be mitigated will be available at DMEM, 555 Cordova Street, Anchorage, Alaska, on February 5, 1982, or may be obtained by writing to DMEM at Pouch 7-005, Anchorage, Alaska, 99510. The public is invited to comment on any aspect of the sale including any proposed term or condition. Comments must be received at DMEM by March 5, 1982 in order to be considered in the final decision of whether or not to hold this sale. A preliminary tract map of the area also is available at DMEM.

Proposed sale 36 includes an area of approximately 57,000 acres. The sale includes about 41,500 acres of submerged lands north of Prudhoe Bay near the Midway Islands and about 15,500 acres of both submerged lands and uplands in the Flaxman Island - Canning River region west of the Arctic National Wildlife Refuge. The tracts in the vicinity of the Midway Islands were included in the Joint State/Federal Beaufort Sea Sale held in December, 1979. The tracts in the Flaxman Island - Canning River area were included in a proposed Point Thomson Lease Sale that was cancelled in 1978. The entire proposed sale area is within the North Slope Borough. Communities in the vicinity of the proposed sale include Kaktovik, Nulaktuk, Barrow, and Prudhoe Bay/Deadhorse.

Approximately 6,200 acres were recently added to the Flaxman Island - Canning River area of the proposed sale. This acreage includes tract C-36-013 and portions of tracts C-36-009 and C-36-012.

Acreage in tract C-36-012 was previously subject to a valid state oil and gas lease and will be added to Sale 36 under AS 38.05.180 (d)(1).

Tract C-36-013 and sections 13, 14, and portions of sections 11 and 12 of tract C-36-009 are contiguous to land already under state lease. The Commissioner of the Department of Natural Resources will hold a hearing under AS 38.05.180(d)(2) in order to determine whether or not the leasing of this acreage would result in a substantial probability of early evaluation and development. This public hearing will be held in Room 6 at the Department of Natural Resources, 555 Cordova Street, Anchorage at 9:00 a.m. on March 4, 1982. Anyone having information relating to this topic is encouraged to testify or submit written comments at this hearing.

If the decision is made that the proposed sale is in the best interest of the state, an "Information to Bidders" packet will be sent to all persons on the DMEM mailing list in March, 1982. If the decision is made to hold the sale, it is tentatively scheduled to occur at the Traveler's Inn in Fairbanks on May 26, 1982 in accordance with AS 38.05.180.
