DECISION ACCEPTING TENDER OF LANDS IN
PERRYVILLE, ALASKA BY OCEANSIDE
CORPORATION TO THE STATE OF ALASKA IN

Pursuant to Section 14(c)(3) of the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act (ANCSA), 85 Stat. 686, AS 44.47.150(a) and 19 AAC 90.015, Oceanside Corporation has offered to convey by surface estate of the following described lands and easements to the State of Alaska, in trust, for any future city that might be established in the Village of Perryville, Alaska:

The surface estate of that certain real property in surveyed Township 49 South, Range 84 West, Seward Meridian, Aleutian Islands Recording District, Third Judicial District, located in the Native village of Perryville, Alaska:

1. Community Land Tract: A 954 acre tract of and interests of U.S. Survey 4993 (the Perryville townsite) and the Perryville airport, including the following improved land: a network of roads and trails, a landfill, two emergency shelter buildings, ten post 1971 homes and the village water system.
2. Dock/Fuel Storage Site: A 3.8 acre tract of land for a proposed dock and fuel storage facility southwest of the village airport.
3. Boat Moorage Road: A 60 foot wide road easement from the village airport southwesterly to the proposed boat moorage site. Containing 4.25 acres more or less.
4. River Access Road: A 80 foot wide road easement from the proposed dock/fuel storage site southwesterly to an unnamed river. Containing 3 acres more or less.

The following additional lands may be conveyed in the future, if airport expansion is needed and boat moorage dock facility is found to be feasible:

1. Airport Expansion Site: Those lands and aviation and hazard easements that are determined to be necessary for a runway extension resulting in a 3,000 foot runway for Perryville, not to exceed 24 acres.
2. Boat Moorage Site: Those lands that are determined to be necessary for a boat moorage dock facility within Section 34 of Township 49 South, Range 84 West, Seward Meridian (near Three Star Point), not to exceed 32 acres.

Aggregating to approximately 995 acres plus those lands that are not to be identified for airport expansion and a boat moorage site.

Adjustments or exclusions may be required to conform with the boundaries of any parcels adjacent to or within the land that may be conveyed by Oceanside Corporation under the provisions of Section 14(c)(1), (2), and (4) of ANCSA.

A complete legal description and map of the parcel is available for inspection at the Department of Community and Regional Affairs, Municipal Lands Trustee Program office in Anchorage.

Pursuant to AS 44.47.150(a) and 19 AAC 90.015, the Municipal Land Trust Officer, acting on behalf of the commissioner of the Department of Community and Regional Affairs, has decided to accept the offer in complete satisfaction of the obligation of Oceanside Corporation under Section 14(c)(3) of ANCSA including the acceptance of less than fee interest for the boat moorage access road and the river access road. The acceptance of less than fee interest for the boat moorage access road and the river access road is determined to be appropriate to prevent difficulties in developing adjacent land. It is also determined that the interest of a future city will not be prejudiced by this acceptance.

This decision was reached after consultation with the village of Perryville, Alaska, through the recognized appropriate village entity, upon weighing the best interests of those residents and any future city that might be established, and upon

an application of the standards in 19 AAC 90.020.

This notice is being posted and published in accordance with the requirements of 19 AAC 90.015(b) and 910. This decision becomes final upon the expiration of 30 days after the date of its receipt by the village corporation or the recognized village entity, the date of publication, or the date of posting, whichever is latest, unless the decision is appealed to the Commissioner in accordance with 19 AAC 90.040.
