Mrs. Marlene Johnson Regrets Larry Brayton's Resignation

Mrs. Marlene Johnson, chairan of the Rural Alaska Comunity Action Program Board of irectors, expressed regret over he resignation of Larry Brayton, irector of RurALCAP.

Brayton resigned last week. he press in Anchorage said his esignation was due to the oard's failure to act to fill existing vacancies in the organization and that the workload was too eavy without adequate persontel.

"I believe Brayton is one of he best organizers I have ever een and for this reason, I have lways been one of his greatest dvocates," said Mrs. Johnson.

Mrs. Johnson said that Rur-LCAP has utilized the services of Larry Brayton for the past wo years. She said he recently otified the board that he will esign in the near future.

"Although there has been much adverse publicity regarding the reasons for his resignation; there is no controversy between the board and Brayton. His reasons for leaving are his own," stated Mrs. Johnson.

"As far as the board is con-

cerned, the working relationship between the board and Brayton has been very good and we hope it will continue so until he leaves us," she continued.

"The board feels it can never repay Brayton for his dedicated work. It will take about five years for us to realize the great impact Brayton has made for RurALCAP. He will continue working in his position as executive director until the board can find a replacement.

"The board hates to see Brayton leave, but since he is leaving RurALCAP I, personally, hope he will not leave this type of work as he has a lot to offer in the fight against poverty."
