NOTICE OF PROPOSED CHANGES IN THE REGULATIONS OF DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES

Notice is given that the Department of Health and Social Services, under the authority of AS 47.05.010 and AS 47.30.477 proposes to amend, repeal, and redraft regulations in Title 7, Chapter 78, of the Alaska Administrative Code, concerning Grant Programs.

(1) 7 AAC 78.020 is proposed to be repealed and redrafted to clarify the relationship between federal or state laws and regulations and 7 AAC 78.

(2) 7 AAC 78.030(a) is proposed to be amended to change the reference from nonprofit corporation to non-profit organization, and make grammatical corrections.

(3) 7 AAC 78.040 is proposed to be repealed and redrafted to eliminate the reference letters of intent which are no longer used by the department, and to clarify the content of the grant agency's public notice of the grant application process.

(4) 7 AAC 78.050 is proposed to be repealed and redrafted to eliminate the reference letters of intent which are no longer used by the department, and to clarify the content of the grant agency's public notice of the grant application process.

(5) 7 AAC 78.060 and 7 AAC 78.070 are proposed to be repealed and redrafted to eliminate the reference letters of intent which are no longer used by the department.

(6) 7 AAC 78.080 is proposed to be repealed because applications are no longer routinely distributed for review.

(7) 7 AAC 78.090 is proposed to be repealed and redrafted to eliminate references to health systems agencies and state advisory boards which no longer routinely review applications, and to clarify the process of application review.

(8) 7 AAC 78.095(a), (b), (c), (d), (e), and (f) are proposed to be amended to correct references to section, make grammatical corrections, to change references to the department to references to the grant agency, to repeal (d)(4) and (d)(14) because they are incorporated in (d)(7), and to add to the grant agency's authority to remove organizations from registers.

(9) 7 AAC 78.100 is proposed to be amended to clarify the criteria for application review.

(10) 7 AAC 78.105(a), (b), (c), and (d) are proposed to be amended to correct references to sections, to change references to the department to references to the grant agency, and to make grammatical changes.

(11) 7 AAC 78.120(d) and (e) are proposed to be amended to eliminate unnecessary language.

(12) 7 AAC 78.130 is proposed to be repealed and redrafted to clarify the department's intent regarding a grantee's duties in implementing state and federal civil rights laws, to increase the availability of statistical records and reports, to repeal former subsection (c) and (d) and remove former subsection (e) to new subsection (c), and to add subsections (d) and (e) regarding dangerous and otherwise objectionable persons who are eligible for grant-supported services.

(13) 7 AAC 78.140 is proposed to be repealed and redrafted to clarify what is required of the applicant in one and two-year grant periods, and to clarify the role of the commissioner and the grant agency.

(14) 7 AAC 78.150 is proposed to be amended to make grammatical changes and to specify that financial records and accounts of the grant project shall be kept such that audits can be performed as prescribed in 2 AAC 45.010.

(15) 7 AAC 78.160(a) and (b) are proposed to be amended to change references to the department to references to the grant agency, to clarify that a grantee may pay a cost only if (among other things) the cost is reflected in the budget or budget amendment approved by the commissioner, and that, before paying a cost related to tuition and training, the grantee must obtain pre-approval from the grant agency of the written training plan.

(16) 7 AAC 78.160(a) and (f) are proposed to be amended to require grant agency approval before a grantee can pay certain expenses related to hiring a consultant, to make grammatical changes, and to eliminate references to situations involving a federal grant.

(17) 7 AAC 78.160(h) is proposed to be repealed and redrafted and 7 AAC 78.160(i) — (o) are proposed to be repealed to substantially simplify the regulations concerning depreciation of assets.

(18) 7 AAC 78.160(j) and (k) are proposed to be amended to make grammatical changes.

(19) 7 AAC 78.160(l), (a), and (f) are proposed to be repealed and redrafted to simplify the requirements concerning a grantee's employee's leave, to eliminate references to "applicable cost principles of the department," and to revise the department's policy regarding indirect costs, specifically requiring a budget revision in specified situations.

(20) 7 AAC 78.160 is proposed to be amended by adding a new subsection which provides that grant funds may not be used to pay for lobbying activities.

(21) 7 AAC 78.170(a) is proposed to be amended to clarify the department's intent regarding the administrative policies of grantees and to eliminate unnecessary language.

(22) 7 AAC 78.180 is proposed to be repealed and redrafted to make grammatical changes and to provide that the cost of subcontracts must be pre-approved by the commissioner in the grant budget or budget amendment.

(23) 7 AAC 78.190 is proposed to be amended to make grammatical changes, to change references to the department to references to the grant agency, and to add that payments may be made for costs that are reflected in approved budget amendments.

(24) 7 AAC 78.200 is proposed to be amended to make grammatical changes.

(25) 7 AAC 78.210 is proposed to be repealed and redrafted to make grammatical changes, to simplify language by using terms that are defined in the definitions section, to add conditions under which a grantee may use grant income, and to delete subsection (b) which provided an exception to the use of grant income.

(26) 7 AAC 78.220 is proposed to be amended to make grammatical changes, to provide that the commissioner makes a grant award rather than the grant agency, and to require the grant agency to follow procedures to preserve confidentiality.

(27) 7 AAC 78.230(a) and (b) are proposed to be amended to make grammatical changes.

(28) 7 AAC 78.250(a) is proposed to be amended to make grammatical changes.

(29) 7 AAC 78.260(a), (c), (d), (a), and (g) are proposed to be amended, and (f) and (h) are proposed to be repealed and to make grammatical changes, to provide that an expense may be paid if included in an amendment to the grant, to clarify the grantee's duties if the grantee wishes to terminate a grant project, to eliminate references to subsection (f) which is repealed, to specify the grantee's duties if indirect costs increase or decrease, to increase the dollar amount of a reallocation that requires grant agency approval from \$500 to \$2000, to repeal subsection (f) regarding approval of reallocation when part of the grant includes federal money, and to repeal subsection (h) because the agency no longer notifies state advisory boards of approved changes in the grant projects.

(30) 7 AAC 78.270 is proposed to be amended to make grammatical changes, to increase the value of non-expendable personal property requiring competitive bids from \$500 to \$600, and to make it clear that the competitive bids must be received from at least three potential suppliers.

(31) 7 AAC 78.280(c), (d), (e), and (f) are proposed to be amended to make grammatical changes, and to require the grant agency to provide instructions to a grantee if the grantee does not wish to retain certain unnecessary grant project assets.

(32) 7 AAC 78.290 is proposed to be amended

to make grammatical changes, to indicate that the commissioner and not the grant agency may terminate a grant, to indicate that a grantee must notify the commissioner and not the department if the grantee terminates the grant, and to remove references to the state advisory board as the board is no longer notified of grant terminations.

(33) 7 AAC 78.300 is proposed to be amended to make grammatical changes.

(34) 7 AAC 78.310(a), (c), and (e) are proposed to be amended to correct references to sections, to make grammatical changes, and to require a hearing officer to perform certain duties within 20 days after the hearing.

(35) 7 AAC 78.230 is proposed to be amended to remove references to health systems agencies and the state clearinghouse because they are no longer used by the department, to clearly indicate when the commissioner is acting as opposed to the grant agency, to make grammatical changes, and to generally make the definitions correspond to the terms as used in 7 AAC 78.010 — 7 AAC 78.310.

Written statements and arguments must be received by 5:00 p.m. on January 17th, 1991.
