

Chief Highlights Meeting

A meeting of an advisory group to the Federal Inspector, held June 3, was highlighted by an appearance by the Traditional Chief of the interior Alaskan Natives.

Traditional Chief Andrew Isaac, who is 82, is one of the most revered native spokesmen in Alaska. The area of interior Alaska that his people inhabit will be most heavily impacted by the gas pipeline. He brought to Washington personally the message of how important it is to his people that the pipeline be built with sensitivity to the environmental and socioeconomic needs of local residents.
