5. The type of election, general or special: The election is a special election.

6. The propositions submitted to the elector are:

- (a) Shall the proposed New Home Rule Charter for the North Slope Borough prepared by the Charter Commission and date February 28, 1974, be adopted:

- (b) Shall the following powers be transferred from existing municipalities within the North Slope Borough and be acquired and exercised as reserved powers by the North Slope Borough: separate vote shall be made on each of the following powers:

- (1) Streets and sidewalks
- (2) Sewers and sewage treatment
- (3) Watercourse and flood control facilities
- (4) Health Services and hospital facilities

- (5) Telephone systems
- (6) Light, power and heating utilities
- (7) Water
- (8) Transportation systems
- (9) Libraries
- (10) Airport and aviation facilities

- (11) Garbage and solid waste collection and disposal services and facilities
- (12) Housing and urban renewal rehabilitation and development
- (13) Preservation, maintenance and protection of historic sites, buildings and monuments.

- (c) Election of two (2) assemblymen to provide for Section 17.020(b) of the proposed Home Rule Charter for the North Slope Borough.
