

# Times Files for Incorporation

The incorporators of the ESKIMO, INDIAN, ALEUT PUBLISHING COMPANY, a new firm that will publish the Tundra Times in the future, have signed the incorporation papers which are now in the process of being filed in Juneau.

The incorporators are: Henry S. Forbes, Milton, Mass.; Paul F. Robison, Anchorage; Howard Rock, Fairbanks; Thomas Richards, Fairbanks; and Lula Young, Fort Yukon.

R. D. Jones, who will be controller of the new firm, is meeting with Paul Robison, corporation lawyer, in Anchorage today to prepare and file required financial statements with the State of Alaska which must precede the sale of stock by 30 days.

"The timetable, it appears, is that stock in the new corporation will be available for purchase about November 18," Jones said.

The date of the third anniversary banquet for the Tundra Times has now been set for December 11, probably at 7:30 p.m. It will also serve as a promotional function for the new corporation. The first annual meeting of the stockholders will be held that evening and this is expected to be brief.

The banquet will be at the Elk's Hall and the catering will be done by the members of the Emblem Club, an auxiliary of the Elks. Prime rib dinner will be the main bill of fare.

The evening's attire is expected to be semi-formal where the women may dress in their formals and the men in their business suits. Natives and non-Native people may come in their most beautiful parkas over their evening's attire.

The admission charge is expected to be \$25. Five dollars will apply for the price of the dinner and the remainder will apply as a minimum sum for the purchase of stocks for each invited guest.
