

New Day Care Consultant

Miss Jane Warner of Boston, Massachusetts, has arrived in Alaska to join the state Department of Health and Welfare staff as day care consultant. George P. Spartz, Public Welfare division director announced this week.

She succeeds Graham S. Lukens who resigned due to serious illness in his family and has left Alaska.

Miss Warner's headquarters will be in Juneau, Mr. Spartz said, but she will work in communities throughout the state where there is need for day care services for children of working parents.

Her duties include consultation to individuals or organizations desiring to establish such centers as well as assistance in licensing of the group facilities which is required by Alaska state law.

He said she will work closely with the Governor's Advisory Committee on Day Care Services in planning and developing the statewide program as well as with the Alaska Community Action program for day care services under the Economic Opportunity Act.

Miss Warner has a background in social work and came to Alaska from the Boston Children's Service Association. She has Master's degrees in Education from Harvard university and in Social Work from Boston University.
