AIDS EDUCATION AND TRAINING CENTER REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS
The Rural Alaska Health Professionals Foundation is requesting proposals for financial support of projects in the general area of health professional training on HIV infection/AIDS, especially mental health issues, and technical assistance to agencies that provide services for people with HIV infection/AIDS.
The Foundation's mission is to improve the health care system in rural Alaska by increasing educational opportunities for rural health care providers and to recruit residents of rural Alaska into the health care professions. The management agent for RAHEC is the Rural Alaska Health Education Center (RAHEC) which is located on the University of Alaska Fairbanks campus. RAHEC has a close association with Area Health Education centers in Montana, Idaho and Washington through grants from the University of Washington AIDS Education and Training Center (U of W AIDS ETC) which is funded by grants from Health Resources and Services Administration and the National Institute of Mental Health.

RAHEC is requesting that proposals for funding be submitted for projects in the following areas:
• To provide training on biomedical aspects of HIV infection/AIDS to health care providers
• To provide training on mental health aspects of HIV infection/AIDS to health care providers
