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### NOTICE OF PROPOSED CHANGES IN THE REGULATIONS OF THE ALASKA DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES

Notice is given that the Alaska Department of Health and Social Services, under the authority vested by AS 47.05.010 proposes to amend the regulations in Title 7 of the Alaska Administrative Code, dealing with grievance procedure, child foster homes, and purchase of social services to implement AS 47.05, as follows:

A new Article 2, 7 AAC 56.210 — 7 AAC 56.240 and 7 AAC 56.300 dealing with grievance procedures for clients, clients' parents or guardian, or a provider of service of the Division of Family and Youth Services, is created so that the above mentioned persons may attempt to settle a grievance quickly and within the division. The new regulations will establish an informal procedure for settling grievances. A division supervisor will initially review the grievance and if a settlement cannot be reached, a regional panel will review the grievance case, hear additional information if necessary, and submit a report to the division Director. The Director will then issue a written decision and the reasons for the final administrative decision.

Article 3, 7 AAC 50.310 — 7 AAC 50.320 dealing with licensing of child foster homes is amended. The proposed child foster home regulations contain the basic standards of care that foster parents must meet in order to be licensed to care for foster children. Some of the proposed changes include: more direct involvement by the foster parents in a foster child's plan of care; annual foster parent training; new time limit restrictions on emergency and provisional licensure; and a section entitled "Reports" which lets the reports and time frame in which a foster parent must submit the report to a placement agency.

Article 2, 7 AAC 53.010 — 7 AAC 53.290 is a new article replacing "Foster Home Care Payments", 7 AAC 50.710 — 7 AAC 50.800. Section 1, "Child Foster Care Payments", contains the payment rates to foster parents for a specific level of foster child care. Article 2, "Children in Custody: Needs and Income", contains the payment for specific costs, such as medical cost. One section, 7 AAC 53.200, deals with the unmet income of a child in state custody.

#### IMPROVEMENT ANNOUNCED FOR SITKA FERRY TERMINAL

George Davidson, System Director, Alaska Marine Highway System, Department of Transportation and Public Facilities, today announced the Department is advertising for bids for Project RS-BR-063668, Sitka Ferry Terminal.

This project will consist principally of replacement of the existing timber truss transfer bridge, abutment and counterweighted lift system and towers. New transfer structures to include a nine 140-foot structural steel bridge with intermediate ramp and apron supported at the shore end on a pile founded abutment and at the seaward end by a 24 x 60 foot barge. Support barge to be repositioned on each side and to be provided with platforms and gangways to allow access from the bridge to the existing mooring structures.

Since replacement structures are on the same alignment as the existing, the terminal will be closed to traffic for a specific period of time between September 6, 1987, and May 29, 1988, and after September 6, 1988, providing certain requirements are met.

Work will also include improvements to the electrical and illumination system and provision of a standby generation system for the terminal along with other minor items of work.

Bids will be opened December 10, 1987, in the Second Floor Conference Room, Room 202, Island Center Building, Douglas, Alaska.
