

Two Natives Buy Buildings At Barrow

Alaska Senator Ted Stevens announced today that two buildings at Barrow have been sold to Alaskans.

The two buildings were put up for sale by the general services administration which it charges with the responsibility for selling surplus government property, Stevens explained.

The buildings which must be removed from their present sites on government land were sold to George N. Ahmaogak of Barrow and Teddy Clark of Nap-iaskiak under a competitive bidding process, the Alaska Senator said.

Since it was signed into law, August 14, 1935, the Social Security Act has been amended eight times to provide greater benefits for workers' families.
