**SPECIAL**—Candidates for a new queen, the second ever to be chosen, are being sought by the Cook Inlet Native Association in Anchorage. Native girls from throughout the state are invited to apply.

Carol Bahr, reigning "Miss Cook Inlet," is in charge of the recruitment. Selection will be made at an outdoor pageant in conjunction with a CINA festival in July.

To be eligible, girls must be high school graduates by next January, at least 18 years of age but no more than 28, never been married and "of good moral character." Charm, grace and talent are

all necessary attributes, Miss Bahr points out, but with the help of advisor Mrs. G.W. Lankford, these qualities can be brought out in most girls.

Many kinds of talents are acceptable, Miss Bahr states. Girls interested in being considered may write to her at 141 E. Fifth Ave., Anchorage.

The new Miss Cook Inlet will receive a scholarship and she will be sponsored by CINA in the Miss Alaska competition.

The festival and pageant are tentatively scheduled for July 4 with plans for a unique outdoor celebration. Among events listed is a kayak race on a lake near Anchorage.
