clothing, or (ii) It is an edible por-tion and sold in Alaskan native

tion and sold in Alaskan native villages and towns. (2) No person who is not an Indian, Aleut, or Eskimo may purchase or otherwise aquire or possess any marine mammal taken persuant to this section except as permitted in this sub-section

(3) No person shall use any aircraft to take any marine mammal in violation of 16U.S.C. 742j-1 Stat. 480, Public Law 92-150.

(c) Notwithstanding the preceding provisions of this section, whenever under the Act, the Secretary determines any species or stock of marine mammal be depleted, he may prescribe reg-ulations persuant to section 103 of the Act upon the taking of such marine mammals by any Indian, Aleut, or Eskimo, and during the existence of such reg-ulations, all takings of such marine mammals by such persons sh-all conform to such regulations.


