Bureau of Land Management Arctic District Office Utility Corridor Draft Resource Management Plan and Environmental Impact Statement

The Arctic District Office of the Bureau of Land Management will hold public meetings in Nulqut and Anaktuvuk Pass. These meetings will provide a public forum to discuss and take formal comments on the Utility Corridor Draft Resource Management Plan and Environmental Impact Statement. One part of these meetings will be a general discussion of BLM's proposed recommendations for managing natural resources throughout the planning area. Another part of these meetings will be a formal public hearing on the subsistence uses and needs within this same area. The public is encouraged to attend these meetings in order to formally and informally express their views on BLM's management recommendations in this draft management plan.

Meeting Schedule

Nulqut

A general public meeting will be held in the Nulqut Kialik Community Center on Wednesday, September 30, 1987, at 7:30 p.m. to discuss and explain the BLM draft recommendations for resource management in the planning area. A formal hearing will immediately follow this general meeting to officially record individual comments on the issue of subsistence uses and needs.

Anaktuvuk Pass

A general public meeting will be held in the Anaktuvuk Pass Community Center on Thursday, October 1, 1987 beginning at 7:30 p.m. to discuss and explain the BLM draft recommendations for resource management in the planning area. A formal public hearing will immediately follow this meeting to officially record individual comments on the issue of subsistence uses and needs.

The Bureau of Land Management encourages and looks forward to your participation at these meetings and hearings. Individuals or group comments on the draft proposals will greatly aid in the formation of the final resource management plan. 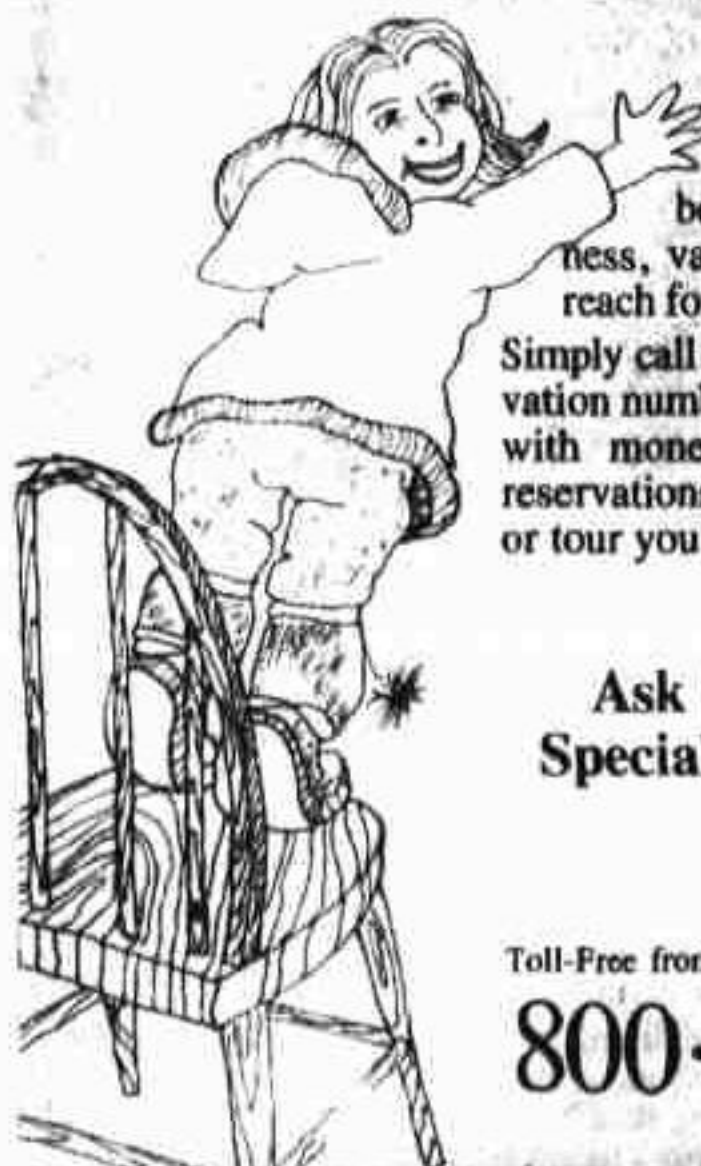
