

Strong backing—

Carter to LUPC?

There is a strong movement in the City of Anchorage to get Harry Carter appointed to take the place of David Jackman, co-chairman of the Federal-State Land Use Commission, who resigned last week.

"Over 200 telegrams in my behalf have been sent to Gov. Jay Hammond," Harry Carter told Tundra Times. "The Alaska Federation of Natives, Inc. has endorsed me for appointment. George Sullivan, mayor of Anchorage, is planning to do the same."

Carter is now deputy director of the Alaska Plan.

"I have served two years in the recent past on the Land Use Planning Commission as a member and I'm vitally interested in serving," said Carter.

Harry Carter has had many years of experience in several state commissions. He spent 10 years in the health department. He has served many years in the

Native organizations and has served as an executive director of AFN, Inc.

"I have been very surprised," Carter went on. "All of my friends from everywhere have been giving me strong support to serve on the planning commission."

"I have many friends in the Fairbanks area and I would very much appreciate their support in getting appointed into the vacancy in LUPC," he added.
