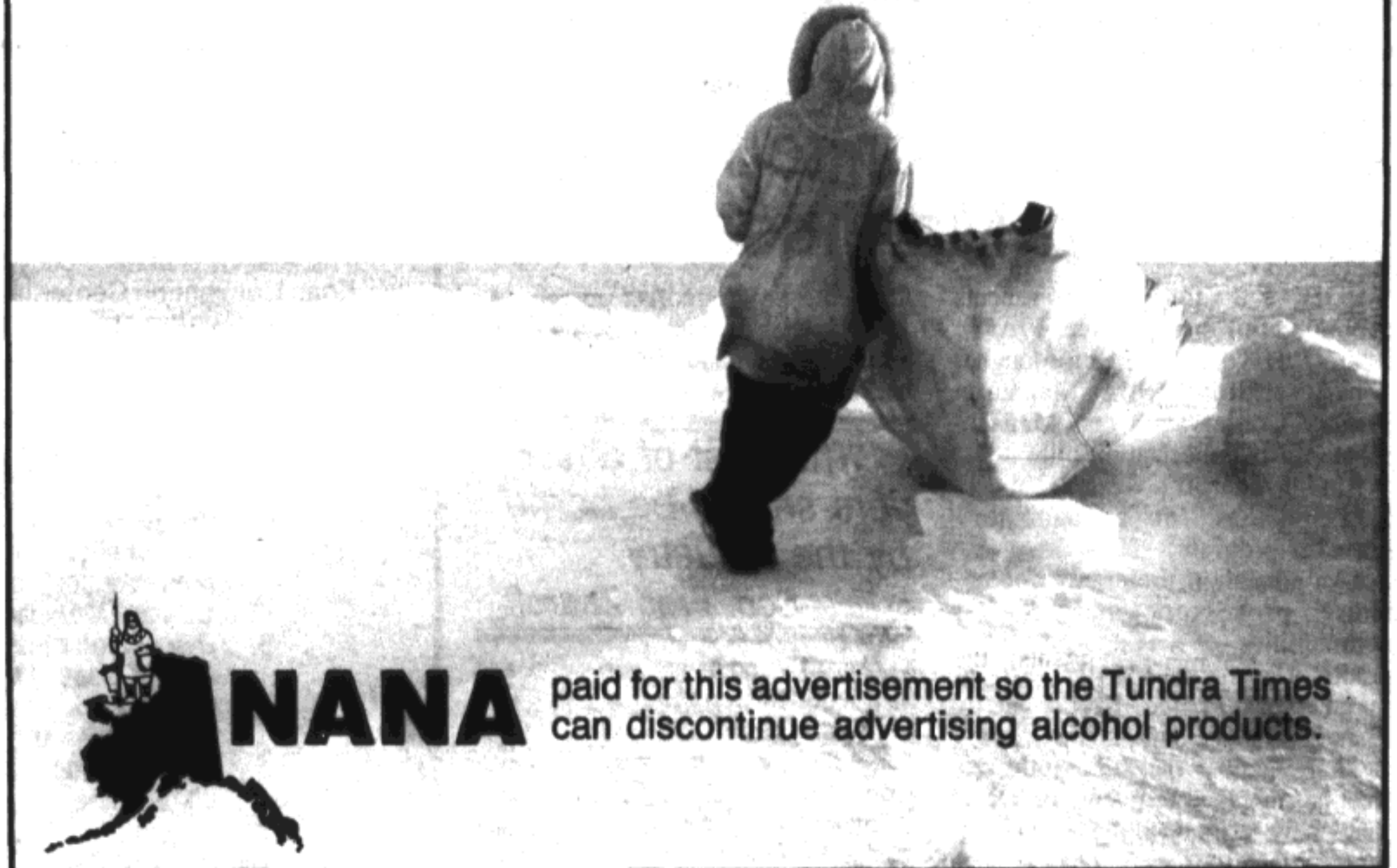


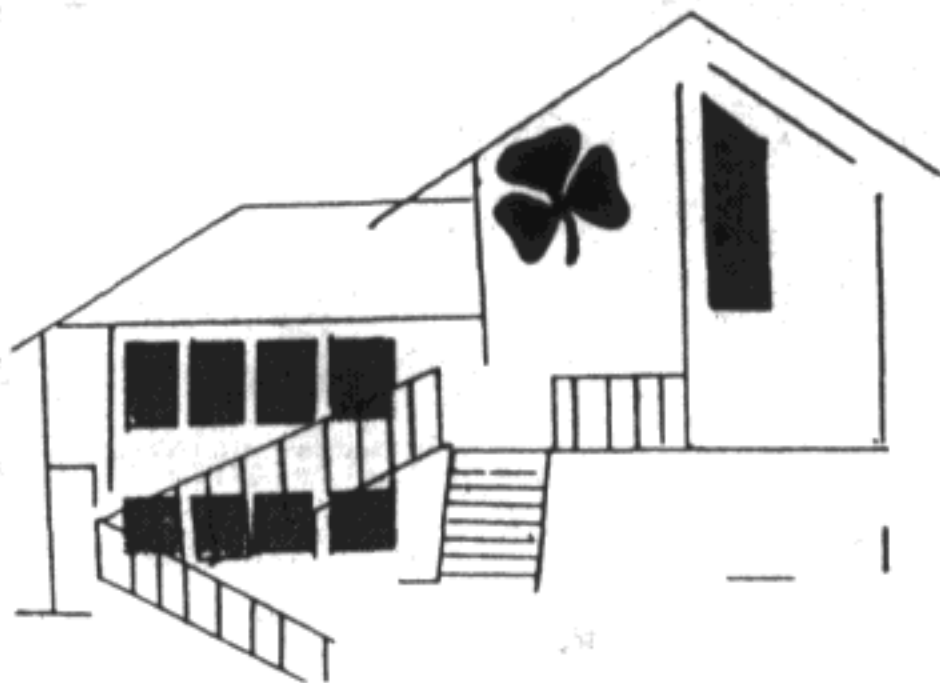

CLARE HOUSE

Are you a Woman in Need of a Place to Stay?

There are as many reasons for homelessness as there are clients. Each individual presents her own unique set of circumstances resulting in a need for a variety of services. Our clients need not only a warm place to sleep, food and clothing, but also support counseling, information and referral to other agencies.

Any woman age 18 or older and her children, who are homeless, with insufficient funds to obtain lodging, are eligible to stay at Clare House. Over 4,000 women and children have received shelter since Clare House opened in 1983.

Each resident is assigned a caseworker who is responsible for assisting them in establishing and achieving short term goals. Examples of goals are; arranging for permanent housing, seeking employment/job training, applying for financial assistance and working on personal issues (alcoholism, medical problems, etc.)

Clare House is currently the only shelter in Anchorage to focus exclusively on homeless women and women with children. It admits clients 24 hours a day every day of the year. . . The facility can house 40 women and children per night.
