

State Collects Record Revenue In Year

Governor William A. Egan has announced that revenues collected by the State in the fiscal year which ended June 30 amounted to a record \$50.8 million.

These revenues were double those which came to the State in 1959, the first year of statehood, and \$3.8 million above revenue estimates for the last fiscal year.

The fiscal 1965-1966 revenue collections exceeded those of the prior fiscal year by some \$9 million, or 22 per cent.

"Unlike conditions in so many other states, this growth in net revenue collections was accomplished without tax increases," Governor Egan emphasized. "It is proof that economic activity

in the State is at an all-time high, that our population is growing, and more people are employed than ever before."
