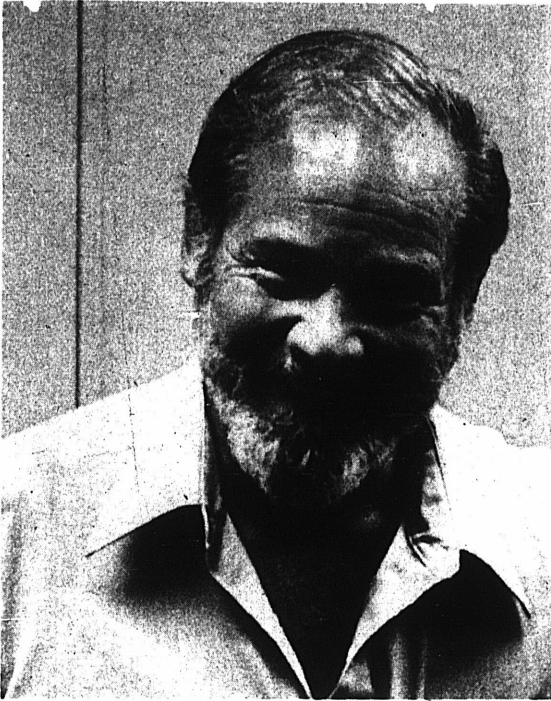


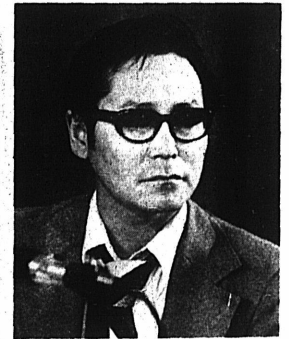

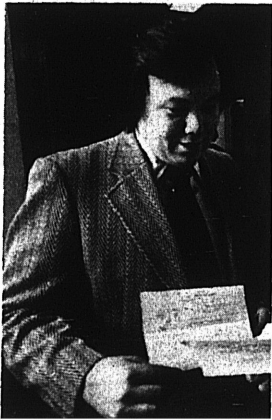
GOVERNOR JAY HAMMOND will serve as the state's top elected official for four more years.



REP. NELS ANDERSON (D-Dillingham) was re-elected by an overwhelming vote in the Bristol Bay area.



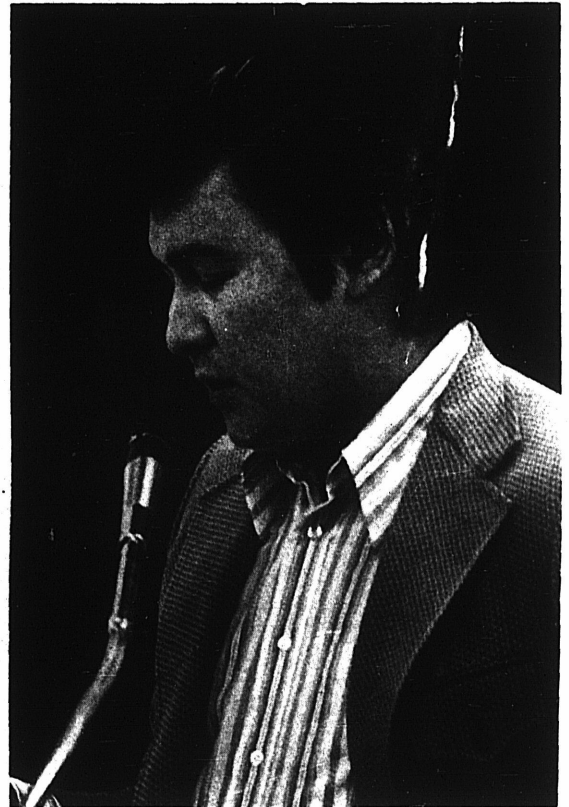
A CLOSE RACE IN BETHEL saw Democrat Phil Guy emerge victorious.
