Officers on board the North Star III figured out that within nine or ten days, weather permitting, they'd finish unloading.

The men, I mean longshoremen, from Barrow alone who listed down

did a fine job with men from Wainwright which is 98 miles off Barrow. Two shifts were going 12 hours a day, day and night. Rate per person was two dollars an hour.

There were more general supplies than ever for the stores here. After unloading, North Star III left Barrow after midnight. Natives from Wainwright who come up by her, went back with her.

And the very same day, one person down at Wainwright got hurt. Plane brought him to Barrow hospital. We do not know how seriously he is when he got hurt while unloading.

Chambers of Barrow Commerce said that those who listed their names down will be first to visit the Nome and Gambell. And after they return, the people who also listed will be next to travel to Fairbanks.

The rate for per person is \$65 round trip. There are over 60 people to Fairbanks. We are giving them good luck.

The whalers here said today that they probably will start this latter part of this month.
