

Vaccination Is Simple Prevention for Smallpox Disease

Of all the contagious diseases, smallpox is one of the easiest to prevent. A successful vaccination, recent enough to give protection, is all that is necessary.

In fact, if every person not protected through having had smallpox would be properly vaccinated, this disease could be stamped out completely.

Vaccination today is safe, quick, painless, and readily available.

Be sure to get vaccination immediately if a case of smallpox is reported in your community. Otherwise about once every three years should be sufficient.

Babies should be vaccinated be-

fore their first birthday, usually in the first three months, unless the physician has a good reason for

delaying the procedure.

Be aware of the danger of smallpox wherever you live or travel.
