

NOTICE

The State of Alaska, Department of Public Works, Division of Aviation, intends to advertise for bids a secondary airport project at Wainwright, Alaska during the latter part of 1965. The project is announced at this time to allow prospective bidders an opportunity to view the site and explore for possible borrow sources before the onset of severe weather and heavy snows.

The project contemplated is a landing strip approximately 100 feet wide by 2500 feet long. The work will consist of formation of a gravel embankment averaging three feet in depth over the existing tundra without disturbing the tundra under the embankment or within 300 feet each side of centerline. The contractor will be expected to locate acceptable material and develop borrow pits. The site of the project is adjacent to and on the southwesterly side of the community along a ridge running northeast-southwest.

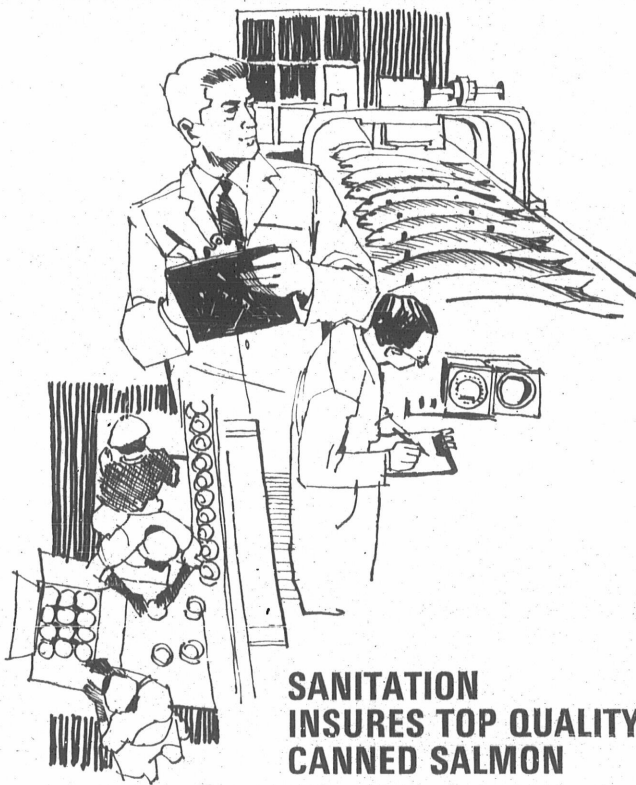
